Overview

This 90-minute session aims to educate rehabilitation professionals on the sequelae of critical illness and the interprofessional management of post-intensive care syndrome (PICS). PICS is a syndrome consisting of new or worsening function in any or all of 3 domains: physical, cognitive, and mental health. With increasing numbers of survivors of critical illness, it is imperative that healthcare providers are able to understand and recognize the problems associated with PICS, utilize standardized outcome measures to describe impairments, activity limitations and participation restrictions and work together in an interprofessional team to improve overall quality of life.

Learning Objectives

Having attended this activity, attendees will be able to:

1. Describe 4 adverse outcomes that survivors of critical illness are at risk for following hospitalization.
2. Define and describe post-intensive care syndrome.
3. Describe the 6 elements of the ICU Liberation Bundle
4. List 6 outcome measures used to identify and track change for the physical, cognitive, and mental health problems associated with PICS.
5. Apply an interprofessional model of care to a survivor of critical illness to identify physical, cognitive, and mental health problems through a case study.
