SDOH SCREENING

WHO

- 2 mos to 10 yrs, then 18+yrs

WHAT

- Before 8/2021 – food insecurity
- After 8/2021 - Mortgage, housing, necessities, transportation, food insecurity

WHERE

- Before 8/2021 – paper or verbal
- After 8/2021- tablets

WHEN

- Yearly at well visits
- At younger ages, every 6 months
- Requested during COVID to screen more often

WHY

- Aprox 17% of PA families are food insecure
- As high as 20% in 2020

CODING NEGATIVE AND POSITIVE

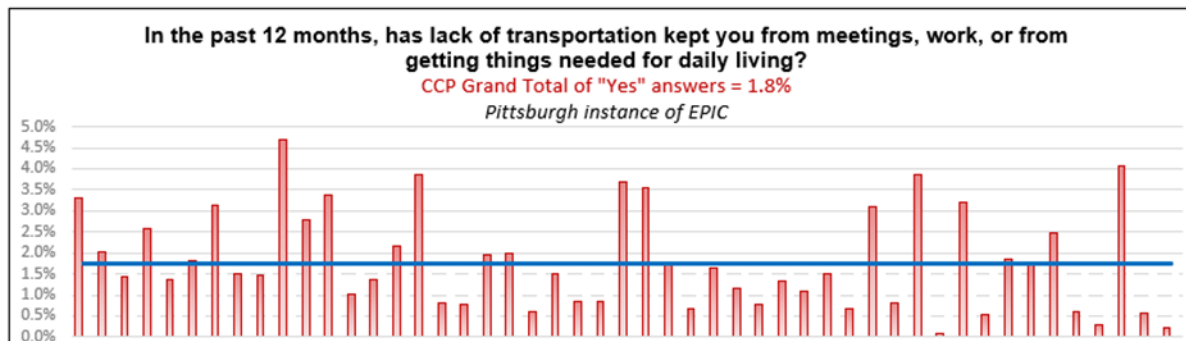
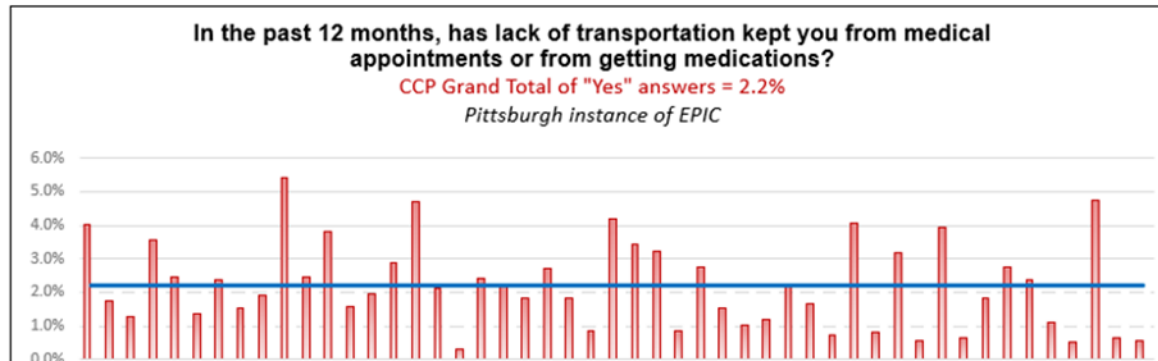
- Negative G code drops automatically
- Positive screen
 - BPA fires in Epic (as of March 2023)
 - Provider uses Epic smartset to choose appropriate concern with Z code attached
 - At the bottom of the note, providers pick the appropriate ACTION

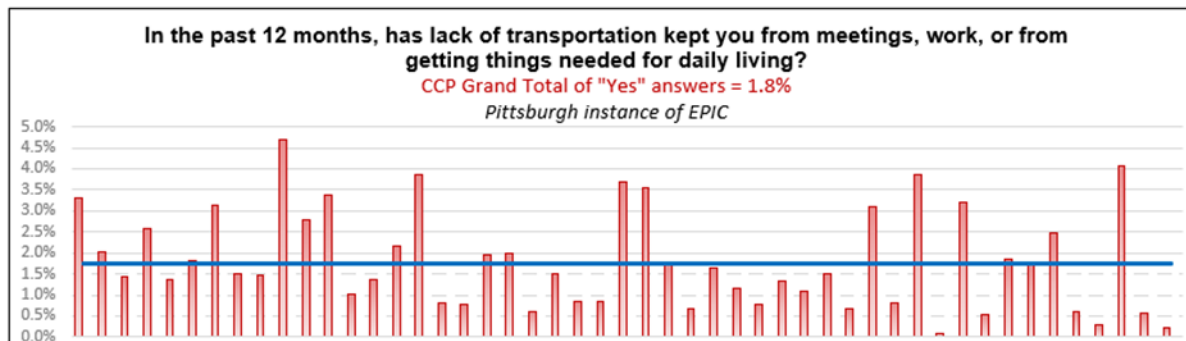
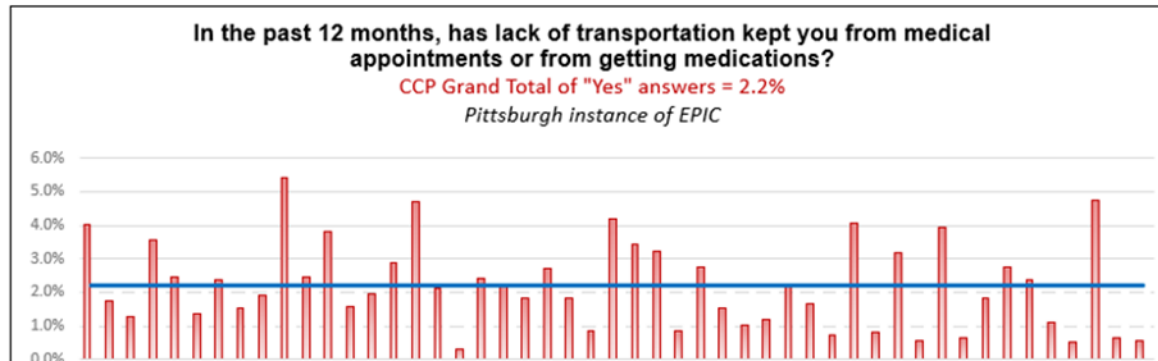

Jan 1 2023 – Mar 31 2023



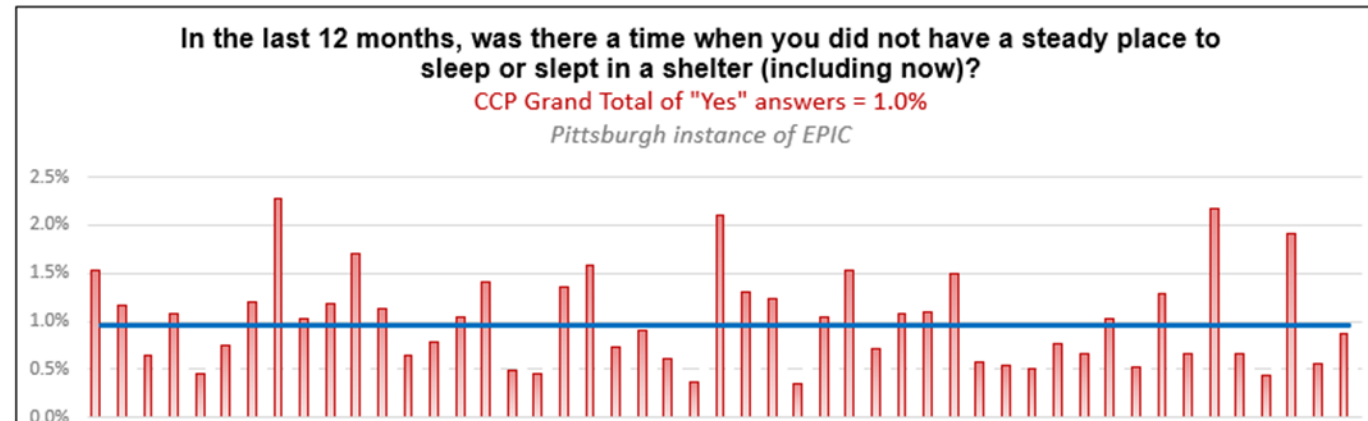
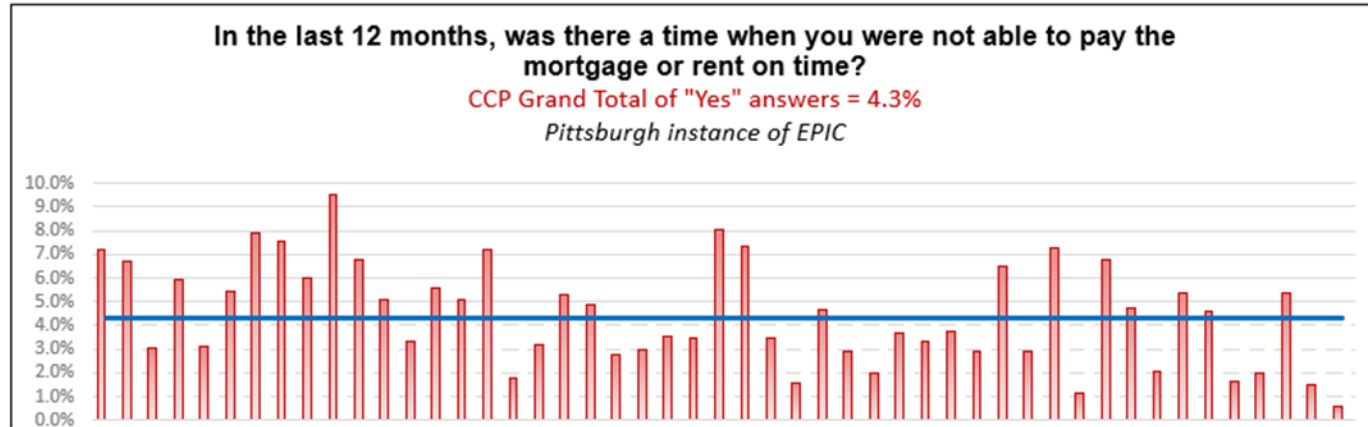

Jan 1 2023 – Mar 31 2023



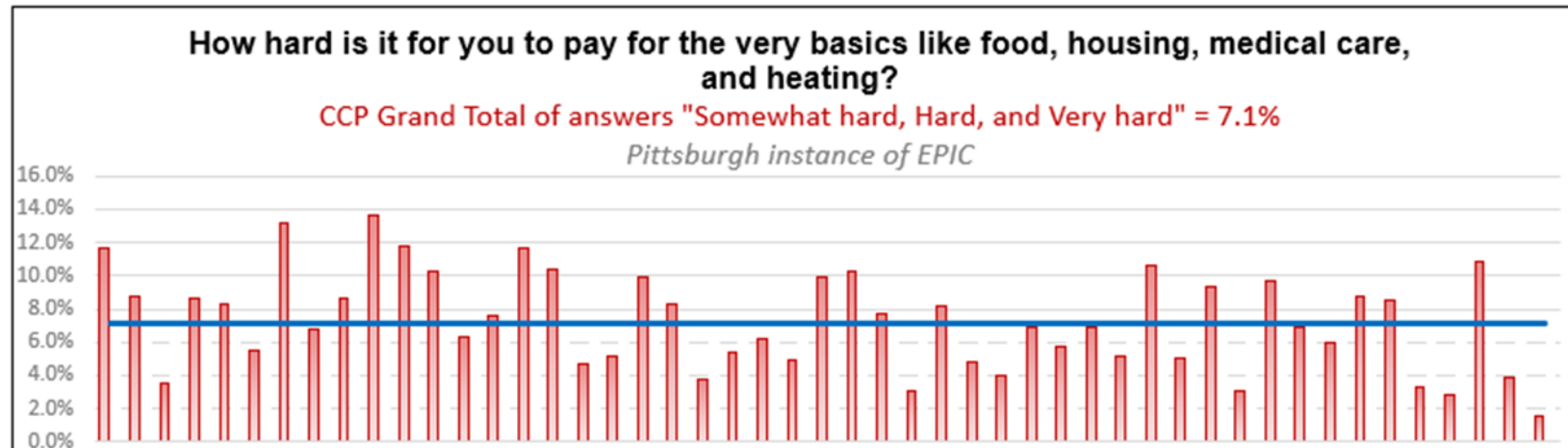
HOUSING
