Recognizing the victims can be challenging, but then what is next? Many times, professionals do not understand how to respond or where to refer potential or actual victims of Human Trafficking. These are the missing layers that prevent a safe exit process for victims. This program is designed to uncover those layers and walk the participant through barriers to resources via experts and a survivor telling her story. The survivor's voice and the recommendations of the experts will help the participants in this program recognize, respond, refer, and report to ensure that victims will be able to journey from uncertainty to trust.
