- Review surgical options for limb salvage
- Examine the management of a colonized wound
- Correlate diagnosis and treatment of wound infections
- Investigate what is antimicrobial stewardship and why all wound care professionals should care
- Assess principles of good antibiotic prescription
- Review of wound biofilms
- Determine the effects of nutrition on wound healing
- Heighten awareness and management of peristomal skin complications
- List 10 benefits of hyperbaric oxygen therapy
