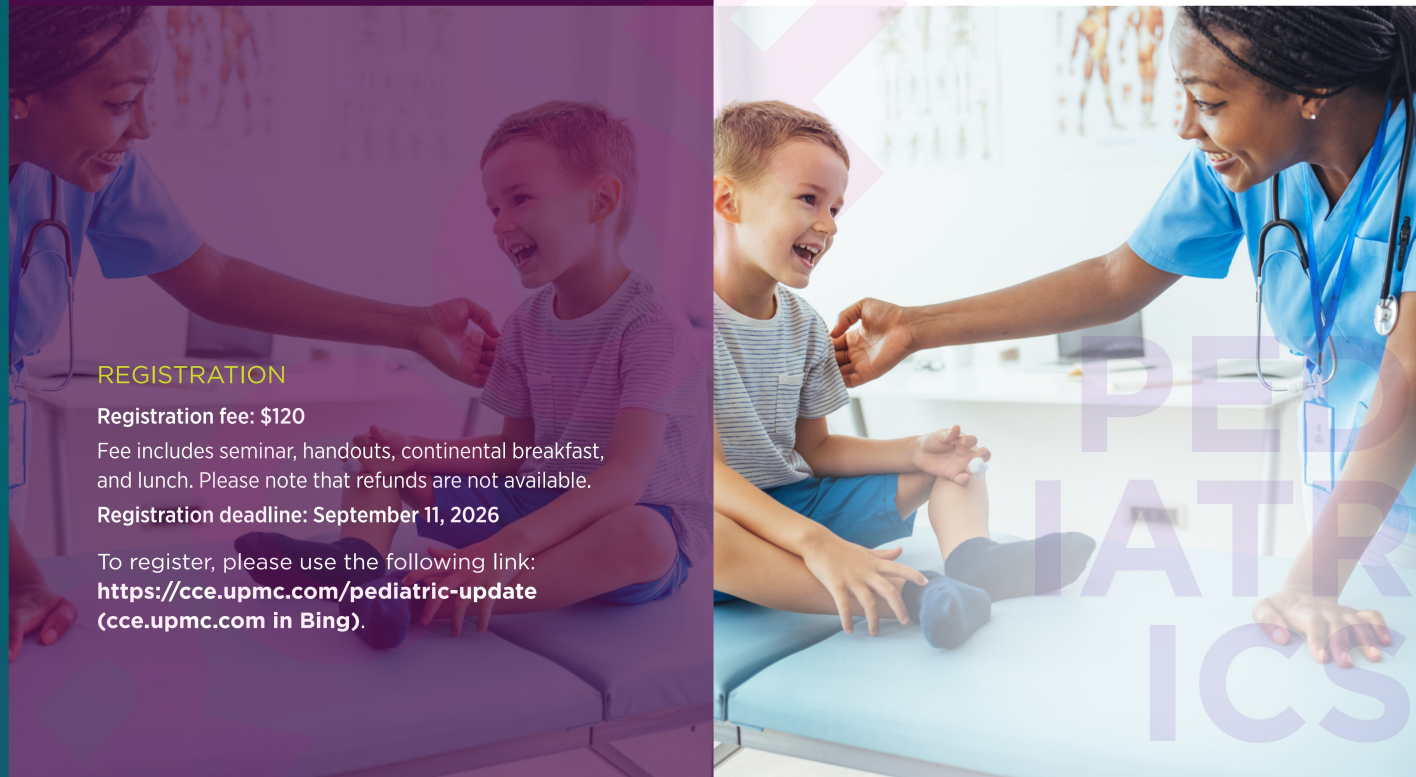

Jillian Staaf, MS, CPST I

Northwest Regional Coordinator, PA Traffic Injury Prevention Project (PA AAP) Jillian Staaf is the Northwest Regional Coordinator for the Traffic Injury Prevention Project and has been a certified Child Passenger Safety Technician since 2006. She became a CPST Instructor in 2025 and has managed a regional child safety seat loan program for more than 15 years. Jillian holds an undergraduate degree from Allegheny College and a master's degree in counseling from Lakeland College. Her work focuses on training new technicians, educating caregivers, and supporting hospitals and community programs to ensure accurate, evidence based child passenger safety practices.
