

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Debra Bogen, MD, FAAFP, FABM

Debra Bogen, MD is the Secretary of Health for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Prior to joining the Commonwealth, Dr. Bogen was the Director of the Allegheny County Health Department, where she and her staff stayed on top of the pandemic and provided consistent, measured and common-sense information to the public while working closely with many stakeholders in the county. Dr. Bogen earned her medical degree from the University of Colorado School of Medicine and completed both her pediatric residency and general academic pediatrics fellowship at Johns Hopkins Hospital. She was one of the founders of the Mid-Atlantic Mothers' Milk Bank and served as the organization's Volunteer Medical Director until assuming her role at the state.



Frank C. Sciurba, MD, FCCP

Frank Sciurba, MD, specializes in pulmonology and is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine. He completed his fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine and medical degree at the University of Chicago. Dr. Sciurba specializes in treating patients with emphysema and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).
