Requirements for Live/Virtual Live Research Poster Sessions

In general, it is challenging to award credit for poster presentations. Poster sessions must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The research/QI project must be based on generally accepted standards of experimental design, data collection, analysis, and interpretation (evidence of this must be provided).
- 2. The poster sessions must have designated start and end times that are listed in the program agenda.
- 3. The posters topics and learning gaps/needs assessment/objectives must fall under the umbrella of the overall conference (if applicable).
- 4. Stand-alone poster presentations (i.e., not part of a larger conference), must be able to fall under one set of learning gaps/needs assessment/objectives.
- 5. At least one author of each poster must be present and available to interact with attendees during the entire designated period in which attendees may earn credit.
- 6. The authors of the posters must complete faculty disclosure forms. Potential conflicts of interest (or lack thereof) must be disclosed to attendees.
- 7. The number of credits is determined by the amount of time designated for interacting with poster authors and self-claimed by the learner.
- 8. There must be a mechanism in place to evaluate the poster session. This evaluation can be incorporated into the overall conference evaluation, if applicable.

Important Note: Poster presentations will not be approved for self-study content (i.e., enduring materials).
